CHURCH SERVICES

A Catholic mass will be offered in the Tabernacle on July 25th at 8am. The Protestant service is at 10am, with Mary Stamp, an ecumenical journalist from Spokane WA and Grand View Park here on Wellesley Island as the speaker. A basket for donations to the Town of Orleans Food Bank will be available at both services. The Tabernacle Choir rehearses with Music Director Nina Brown on Thursday mornings at 10:30am in the TIP Chapel; all are welcome to come and sing!

It's gonna be a very special Saturday: JULY 24th

9:45am: The annual **Tabernacle Triathlon** kicks off with registration at the Swim Cove, with age-appropriate staggered starts for kids and adults. Swim, bike, and run! Maps are posted in the Kiosk at the Four Corners and on the Community Bulletin Board near the Chapel.
